RESPONSIBLE DOG OWNERSHIP



Dog tags are now due, at no cost to the owner. Proof of rabies vaccination within the last 24 months must be shown. Please remember it is unlawful to have your dog **running at large** and fines may be levied. A dog may be deemed running at large if found in any place other than the premises of the owner of the dog and not under the control of a competent person .

NEW RABIES VACCINE PROTOCOL



Ontario Law Effective July 1, 2018

Every owner having the care and custody of a dog, cat or ferret three months of age or over shall ensure that the dog, cat, or ferret is immunized against rabies.

The immunization against rabies shall be,

- Carried out by a veterinarian registered under the *Veterinarians act: and*
- By inoculation with rabies vaccine that is licensed for use in Canada and is administered in accordance with the instructions of the manufacturer who produced the vaccine.

Spring Clean-Up

Council has set disposal site hours for spring clean-up days as:

Saturday	May 26, 2018	9 a.m. to 5 p.m.
Sunday	May 27, 2018	9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

There is no charge for all household waste during these days, businesses are excluded. Items to be burned will not be accepted if a fire ban is in place. Do not put recyclable material in the land fill!

Items not taken at the Laird Waste Disposal Site:

- Batteries
- Used Oils
- Paints
- Hazardous Materials
- Liquids
- Biomedical Wastes
- Radioactive Materials (Florescent bulbs)
- Styrofoam
- Computer & other electronic devises

Share Shed Guidelines

ACCEPTABLE Items Include:

- ✓ Small Household Items
- ✓ Books and Magazines
- ✓ Children's Toys (NO Fabric)
- ✓ Sports Equipment
- ✓ Small Appliances (in working condition)
- ✓ Tools (in working condition)

UNACCAPTABLE Items Include:

- ✗ Hazardous Materials or Waste
- ✗ Liquids of any kind
- ✗ Clothing or Stuffed Animals
- ✗ Large Appliances
- ✗ Microwave Ovens
- ✗ Upholstery Furniture

Household Hazardous Waste Depot

The **Household Hazardous Waste Depot** is located to 402 Fifth Line East (SSM City Landfill).

They now accept **Electronics** and **Packaging** Styrofoam.

Please remove all power cords prior to drop off.
